Midway through December, the Christmas plans changed. And as we met afterhours with the Friday evening volunteers, the one take-away was that while the plan had to change the opportunity to minister could be elevated to a new level. The youth were not able to come to us, collectively, we would go to them. And *Operation Christmas Drop* was set in motion!

The stuffing for sixty stockings came to us in just the amount needed. Gift cards, socks, gloves, candies, toothpaste and brushes, Chapstick and assorted school supplies were stuffed into each stocking. Over the next few days, they were delivered to our youth - surprising them on the steps and porches of their homes. The added level of ministry was the ability to meet their parents, extending our prayers and greetings to them as well.

Along with the stockings, we delivered boxes of homemade Christmas cookies at each stop. A partnership with LCBC Manheim - Be Rich – has made this possible over the last few years as their families and life groups chose to serve by baking cookies specifically for Cornerstone. Over 70 dozen cookies were received from the bakers and our volunteers packaged assortments of cookies as a special treat for our youth to enjoy.

On Monday, January 4, we welcomed youth back into the building, continuing our mission to share the hope of Jesus to the youth of our community!


