### **EMPOWER YOUTH LEADERSHIP INITIATIVE**

In 1998, a group of local pastors and citizens had a vision to create a place designed to disciple young men and women to become Godly leaders in their schools, families, and community. It was because of this vision and heart for the youth of our community that Cornerstone Youth Center was born. This summer, with the support of the Link Bank Foundation. Cornerstone introduced a new program entitled "The Empower Youth Leadership Initiative." The goal of this program was to empower the youth of our community. and provide them with the skills, resources. and support necessary to unlock their leadership potential and become positive influencers in our community.

## **5 PILLARS OF EMPOWER**

- 1) Building a Life of Character and Integrity
- Developing Healthy Relationships and Establishing Boundaries
- 3) Conflict Resolution and Overcoming Obstacles
- 4) Financial Management and Fiscal Responsibility
- 5) Community Service and Civic Responsibility

The students who participated in this program had the opportunity to engage in a series of carefully crafted workshops, activities, and mentorship opportunities focused on developing essential leadership skills, such as effective communication, teamwork, decisionmaking, and conflict resolution. Activities that the students completed included: Archery, Escape Rooms, Obstacle Courses, a "Mock Trial", Budgeting Exercises, and an Amazing Race. Each activity demonstrated one of the key elements of the program. There were 11 students who participated in Empower, and 7 that successfully completed all the requirements to graduate! We are so proud of the students who completed the program, and are on a path to becoming agents of positive change and transformation, and who inspire their peers to achieve all that God has created them to be. The motto that the students recited each day articulates our hope for each of them:

"As a child of God, I pledge to uphold the values of integrity, respect, purity and discipline. I will strive to serve others and be a positive example. I will always choose to do what is right and avoid what I know is not. With God's help, I will become all he has created me to be."
