Thoughts From The Director's Chair...

I recently was having a conversation with one of our staff members about the growth of our ministry over the past year. Each day we see between 15–25 middle and high school students during regular programming. Our middle school student attendance has grown 76% over the past 18 months. Our "Treasure Hunters" group, which is an optional time after our Scripture lesson, has grown from 1–2 students to more than 6–7 students. We talked about how our high school boy's discipleship group has grown from 4–5 students to over 10 in the past few months, and how our middle school discipleship group has also seen 4–6 students faithfully attending. Our high school girl's discipleship began in the spring, and recently had 5 girls participate.

Although it is easy to compare numbers and see the growth in attendance, it is more challenging to articulate the growth in maturity and the spiritual growth of our students.

Recently we have seen students regularly praying with and for each other. We see students bringing prayer requests through our prayer box. We see students asking questions about Jesus and about the TWiG (Time With God) lesson each day. We see students participating in deeper Bible study after regular program hours and getting involved in going to church or participating in other church youth activities, and we are thankful for what God is doing through the ministry of Cornerstone! We are very thankful to our staff, volunteers, donors, and prayer partners who make this all possible.

Research shows programs that included active learning opportunities, teamwork through sports or games, and promoting conflict resolution skills were most effective. Every student that comes through the doors of Cornerstone has an opportunity to take part in our creative arts club where they learn a new skill set, sports/games, TWiG (Time With God) and more. Not only do we see the evidence of an engaged youth community, we see a shift in students' spiritual journey, their courage, and their ability to tackle life's hardships with confidence and know they are not alone.

2 to 6 p.m.: The Prime Time for Juvenile Crime in the U.S.



#AfterschoolFightsCrime

Prime time for Juvenile Crime is between 2:00pm-6:00pm. A survey of teens and parents found that bored teens reported making poorer choices. Communities with after-school youth centers report:

Reduced Crime:

- 28-35% reduction of total arrests.
- 45-50% reduction in violent crime.

Higher Academic Achievement:

- 68 after-school programs across the United States found that participants did better,
 - o On reading and math achievement tests
 - Achieved higher GPAs
 - Had higher school attendance

Improved Behavior:

 Youth got along better with others and were less likely... to engage in socially risky choices.

Healthier Habits:

- There was also evidence that these positive changes persist over time when they reached aged 20, young adults... were more likely:
 - o to be in the education field
 - to be a volunteer in their free time

Because of Cornerstone's commitment to afterschool programming, combined with your help and support, we are witnessing these positive outcomes. A reminder of the valuable outcome that makes the investment worthwhile.
